What is Title !?

- * Title I is the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools.
- * The goal of Title I is a higher quality of education for every child.
- * The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools each year.

How Title I Works?

- * The federal government provides funding to states for Title I.
- * The Florida Department of Education allocates money to the district.
- * The school district identifies eligible schools and allocates Title I funds.
- * Boulware Springs implements a schoolwide program.

Title I Funds

- * Boulware Springs Charter School is provided funds to pay for services and programs for our students.
- * Title I funds pay for the following at our school:
 - * Title 1 Reading Teacher
 - * Additional Reading Curriculum/Supplies
 - * Extended Day Tutoring

- * Our school has also been provided funds to pay for parent engagement activities throughout the year which we use for:
 - Parent Trainings / Activities

Parent's Rights

It is your right to:

- *Be involved and request regular meetings to express your opinions and concerns;
- *Be provided information on your child's level of achievement on state assessments in reading/language arts, writing, mathematics, and science;
- *Request and receive information on the qualifications of your child's teacher; and
- *Be informed if your child is taught by a non-highly qualified teacher for four or more consecutive weeks.

- * Florida's academic content standards establish high expectations for all students.
- * Next Generation Sunshine State Standards and Florida State Standards will identify what your child needs to know and be able to do in all content areas.
